From which, differentiating with respect to x and to z , and remembering that for each segment of every such sphere, $r^2 = 2rz$, where r is the radius of the sphere, we get, after some trifling reductions, $\frac{r}{r_2} = \frac{r}{r} - \frac{1}{2}(\sec 4 - \cos 4)$, which manifestly prove the two properties in question.
