In the eastern and central portions of Kansas, where wheat cut with the binder is allowed to stand in the shock until threshed, much of it deteriorates in quality and condition because of this exposure to the weather. Much of it stands out in poorly set-up shocks, unprotected by cap bundles, and the effect of alternate rain and sun is to cause the branny coat to swell, loosening it from the endosperm, and the kernels to lose their natural bright appearance, or bloom. The amount of moisture in the kernels increases, and continued exposure will soon cause the grains to sprout. All this injury causes the wheat to give a...
